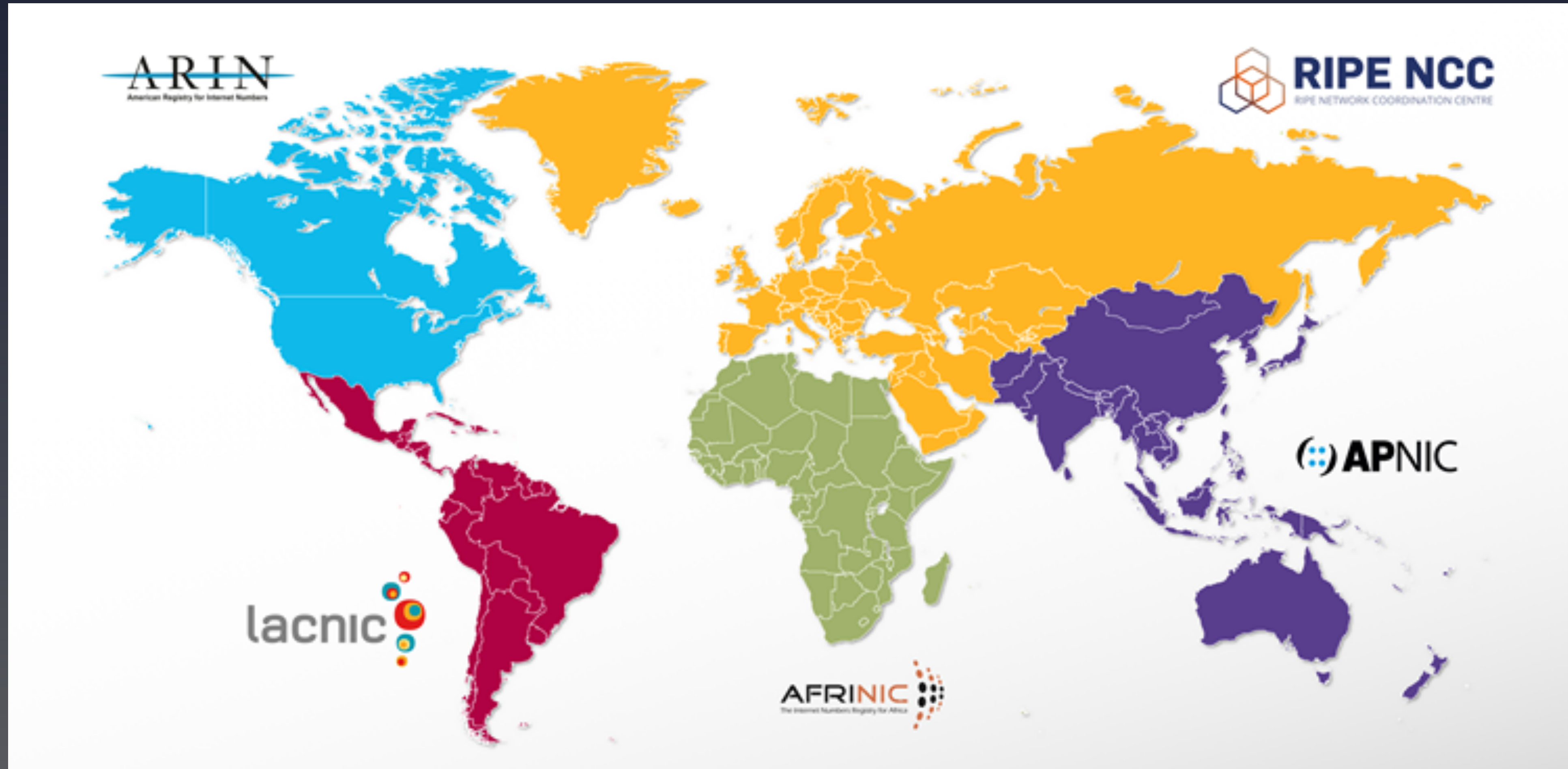

About the RIPE NCC



- One of five Regional Internet Registries (RIRs)
- We distribute IP addresses and ASNs
 - and maintain the registry of which organisations hold which resources - for Europe, the Middle East and parts of Central Asia

Who We Are Accountable To



- RIPE community as their secretariat
 - Facilitating the discussions and implementing their policies
- RIPE NCC members as a membership-based association under Dutch law
 - Being neutral towards our members and treating them equally
- Governments in our service region
 - Complying with Dutch and EU law
 - Understanding the implications of other national legislation that applies to our members
- Global system of Internet Governance and Internet Operations
 - Internet Registry system, root servers

Accountability to the Whole Region



- Compliance to world-wide respected business standards
- Mismatch and/or conflicting national legislation may have severe effects on the security and reliability of the Internet
- We act like we are regulated so that we do not have to be



ISO and ISAE Certifications



- In 2023, we began a project to achieve certification against ISO/IEC 27001, an internationally recognised information security framework
- We plan to establish and maintain ISO 27001 compliance company-wide, starting with critical RIPE NCC services
- As part of this, we will implement a risk-driven compliance monitoring programme designed to promptly address potential gaps
- We are also undertaking an ISAE 3000/SOC 2 Type I & Type II audit of our RPKI service

Reporting Compliance



- On a quarterly basis
 - Quarterly Sanctions Transparency Reports: Q4 2023
- On an annual basis (as part of the Annual Report)
 - GDPR
 - “Right to be forgotten” requests
 - Data breach incidents reported to the authorities
 - Law Enforcement requests
 - Law Enforcement Agency Requests 2022

The RIPE NCC and Europol



- The RIPE NCC has a history of collaboration with Europol
 - 2016: Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to exchange technical expertise on cybercrime and Internet security
 - 2018: RIPE NCC Roundtable Meeting, hosted by Europol's European Cybercrime Centre (EC3)
- Europol and other LEAs are invited to share their concerns with us about data access or other matters, either directly or on RIPE community mailing lists

Preserve the Global Internet



- The public core of the Internet must remain interoperable
 - Any political decisions should not affect global connectivity
- EU authorities understand the importance of preserving the Global Internet and the role of the RIPE NCC
 - Great cooperation during NIS2 discussions about the root servers' operations
 - Great support by the Dutch MFA regarding sanctions implementation and RU exemptions

Cooperation



- The RIRs provide neutral platforms for their communities to come together to develop policies - accommodating the unique political, legal, cultural and social realities of the regions they serve
- We are a centre of excellence for data, measurements and tools that provide insight on the Internet and its operations
- We support governments and policy makers in developing informed public policy positions
